What aspects of modern Latin American fiction have been carried into English and what left behind? Boom and Bust seeks answers to these questions through a survey of key Latin American texts and their English translations. The module addresses the following issues: the linguistic and theoretical transfer of categories such as magical realism and the baroque; the roles of individual translators, publishing houses and funders in the production of translation; and the critical reception of the translated texts in journalistic and academic contexts.

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The modern novel. In prose fiction the vanguardia did not arrive as quickly. The first step was a renovation of the novel but within accepted 19th-century Realist forms. The first novels to be considered modernâ€”that is, contemporaryâ€”in Latin American fiction were those written during and about the Mexican Revolution (1910â€”20).Â Whereas the regionalist novel aspired to give a direct, unmediated version of Latin American reality, Borges furnished one that was avowedly bookish and thus derived from the Western tradition. Borges saw in gaucho tales the repetition of Greek and biblical mythsâ€”not fresh stories from a new world but reiterations of the same old world.
