The Protean Scot's published subtitle, 'The Crisis of Identity', points instead to Ken's interest in psychological, as well as rhetorical, complexity. It is an allusive, tantalising, self-conscious, and sometimes frustrating book, yet it is also based on wide reading, shrewd critical insight, and contagious enthusiasm, and it was deservedly successful. His new research profile brought him wider recognition and contacts. He joined the Eighteenth-Century Scottish Studies Society in its first year, participated regularly in its conferences, and was the society's president.
