Moral Education in Contemporary Education. The task of moral education has, in recent years, been reinvented in many countries. Currently, the most used concept is that of citizenship development. Approaches to ethics that give primacy to character, relationships, and communities often use stories as a methodology. According to Nelson (1997), these stories: heighten moral perception and sensitivity; promote moral education; provide ethical justification; define one's moral identity; and make ethical evaluations through comparing stories. The term "narrative ethics"™ refers to a cluster of methodologies that use stories, rather than a theoretical approach to ethics. Chapter 9. Moral Education.
