THE WAY FORWARD – and a Time of Prayer!

The United Methodist Church has been engaged in a process called **The Way Forward** to find a way through conflicting ideas represented by the variety of expressions connected to the gay, lesbian, and transgender culture in our world.

The Commission on a Way Forward was proposed by the Council of Bishops and approved by the 2016 General Conference to do a complete examination and possible revision of every paragraph of the Book of Discipline concerning human sexuality and explore options that help to maintain and strengthen the unity of the church.

After its meeting in April of this year in Washington, D.C., members indicated they were leaning toward a simpler structure with clearer processes for decision-making and accountability for the United Methodist Church in its mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ. Conversations at that meeting showed a commitment to finding a way forward that honors the complexity of the global denomination and the unity of a shared faith in Christ.

The team started to prepare an initial draft plan for review at the July meeting. The commission's ultimate assignment is to present its report to the Council of Bishops for action at the Special Session of General Conference set for February 23-26, 2019 in St. Louis, Missouri.

Each of the "Conferences" throughout the United Methodist *Connection* are encouraged to pray for the mission and the future of the Church. **The West Virginia Conference is assigned the first week of October to pray for "The Way Forward."** More information about this week of prayer will be forthcoming.

2017 BISHOP'S SUMMIT ON DIVERSITY & INCLUSION:

In October, the Bishop's Summit on Diversity will provide meaningful and safe places to address racism,

diversity and how we can better relate with one another as Christ followers and Kingdom builders.

Beginning Friday, October 6, at Noon and ending on Saturday at 3:30 p.m. the Bishop's Summit on Diversity and Inclusion will be held at Cedar Lakes, near Ripley, WV.

This year's Summit on Diversity and Inclusion will include a second phase of training in the area of Intercultural Competency. A special focus will include training in the area of ministry with persons with disabilities. We will be led by *Giovanni Arroyo*, who serves our church as team leader for Program Ministries for the General Commission on Religion and Race, and *Bishop Peggy Johnson*, who serves our church as the Episcopal Leader of the Philadelphia Area which includes the Penn-Del and Eastern PA Conferences. We will also enjoy the Martin Luther King Jr. Men's Chorus and the Steel Drum group from St. Marks United Methodist Church in Charleston, WV.
