Established in 1730 as Bajada de Santa Fe, an outpost of the Santa Fe region to halt the incursions of the Charruan peoples, the small settlement became a resting station on the route between Buenos Aires and Asunción. In defiance of the primacy of Buenos Aires, General Justo J. de Urquiza declared Paraná the capital of United Provinces of the Río De La Plata in 1853 and it remained so until 1862. R. E.
