Ben and his retired search and rescue dog brave dangers to locate an injured runaway puppy. (intermediate)

The One and Only Ivan by Katherine Applegate

When Ivan, a gorilla, meets Ruby, a baby elephant, he decides to find her a better life. 2013 Newbery Medal. (beginning)

Warcross by Marie Lu

Emika Chen is a bounty hunter and a hacker in futuristic NYC. One night she hacks into an “unhackable” playoff game of Warcross (like Fortnite) and draws way more attention to herself than intended. (advanced)

The Hunger Games by Suzanne Collins

Katniss is pitted against teens from the other districts of her country in a televised fight to the death where she must decide whether to kill or be killed. First in a trilogy. (advanced)

Can You Survive the Jungle? by Matt Doeden

Your choices determine whether you live or die. (beginning)

Spy School by Stuart Gibbs

Ben leaves his public middle school to attend the CIA's secret Espionage Academy. Sequel: *Spy Camp*. (intermediate)

Escaping the Giant Wave by Peg Kehret

While vacationing in Oregon, an earthquake hits and Kyle must make life and death decisions for himself and his little sister before the incoming tsunami makes landfall. (intermediate)

Overdrive by Eric Walters

When a street race goes horribly wrong, Jake must make some hard choices. (beginning)

BIOGRAPHY

The Red Bandanna (Young Reader's Adaptation) by Tom Rinaldi

Welles Crowther didn't see himself as a hero. But on September 11, 2001 when his ordinary work day at the World Trade Center in New York turned lethal, he showed those around him how a true hero acts. (intermediate)

Etched in Clay: The Life of Dave, Enslaved Potter and Poet by Andrea Cheng

The story of a man, who lived enslaved in South Carolina in the early 1800's, who became a skilled potter and defied the law to record his life in clay. (nonfiction) (intermediate)

El Deafo by Cece Bel

In this graphic novel, Cece Bel retells her story of growing up with hearing loss, trying to make friends, and deciding that her awkward giant hearing aid gave her super powers. (graphic novel) (intermediate)

Stolen Into Slavery: The True Story of Solomon Northup

by Judy & Dennis Fradin

A free black man, Northup was kidnapped and forced into enslavement for 12 years in Louisiana until his friends rescued him. (nonfiction) (intermediate)

X: A Biography of Malcolm X by Jessica Gunderson

This graphic novel tells the story of Malcolm X's journey from his role as spokesperson for the Nation of Islam to his role as crusader for human rights. (nonfiction) (beginning)

Black Elk's Vision: A Lakota Story by S.D. Nelson

The story of the Lakota medicine man who fought at Little Bighorn and Wounded Knee. Includes many original photos. (nonfiction) (intermediate)

Who Was Abraham Lincoln? by Janet B. Pascal

A biography of America's sixteenth president. (nonfiction) (beginning)

Who Was Steve Jobs? by Pam Pollack & Meg Belviso

The biography of the college dropout genius who attended business meetings barefoot and created a technology empire. (nonfiction) (beginning)

CLASSICS

My Side of the Mountain by Jean Craighead George

A young boy relates his adventures during the year he spends alone in the Catskill Mountains. (beginning)

Charlie and the Chocolate Factory by Roald Dahl

Charlie and five others win a guided tour of a legendary candy factory that no outsider has seen in 15 years. (intermediate)

Hatchet by Gary Paulsen

Brian's plane crashes in the Canadian wilderness and he must survive on his own with nothing but a hatchet. (intermediate).

Edgar Allan Poe's Tales of Terror (Random House Stepping Stones edition) by Les Martin

Four chilling tales adapted for easy reading: "The Masque of the Red Death," "The Cask of Amontillado," "The Tell-Tale Heart," and "The Pit and the Pendulum." (beginning)

The Westing Game by Ellen Raskin

Mysterious multimillionaire Samuel Westing reaches from the grave to make sixteen unlikely people compete in a game of his own devising. (Intermediate)

Holes by Louis Sachar

sequel: **Small Steps**

Stanley, sent to a boys' detention center, must dig holes all day long--what's the warden looking for? (intermediate)

The Outsiders by S.E. Hinton

A story of friendship; a gang of wealthy kids (socs) and a gang of "greasers" get into a fight with dire consequences. (advanced)

HISTORICAL FICTION

Nathan Hale's Hazardous Tales series by Nathan Hale

Book 1: **One Dead Spy** (also by this author: **One Trick Pony**)

The author begins his series retelling the roughest, toughest, craziest stories from history with this tale of his namesake, Nathan Hale, America's first spy. (graphic novel) (beginning)

Ghost Hawk by Susan Cooper

At the end of a winter-long journey into manhood, Little Hawk returns to find his village has been the victim of a white man's plague. (advanced)

Chains

By Laurie Halse Anderson

Isabel must fight for freedom--and spy on the enemy-- for herself and her sister after she is re-sold into slavery to a Loyalist household during the Revolutionary War. (advanced).

In The Footsteps of Crazy Horse

by Joseph Marshall & James M. Yellowhawk

The story of the life of Crazy Horse, Lakota leader and warrior who stood with Sitting Bull against the US government, as told to Jimmy Maclean, a young boy struggling to understand his own Scottish/Lakota ancestry. (intermediate)

Half a Man by Michael Morpurgo

Michael has always been fascinated and afraid of his war-scarred grandfather, until he eventually spends his summers with him and learns the story behind the scars and the man beneath them. (intermediate)

I Survived the Japanese Tsunami, 2011 by Lauren Tarshis

A huge earthquake and wave hit Japan while Ben is visiting, leaving him stranded alone. (beginning)

A History of Just About Everything: 180 Events, People and Inventions That Changed the World by Elizabeth MacLeod, Frieda

Wishinsky & Qin Leng

Chronicles some of history's most important events, from the building of the pyramids and the invention of paper to the creation of the internet. (nonfiction) (intermediate)

I Will Always Write Back by Martin Ganda and Caitlin Alifirenka, with Liz Welch

This true story is based on a friendship that began in 1997 when a 12-year old girl is given a pen pal in Zimbabwe. Neither 14-year-old Martin nor Caitlin could have predicted how much their letters would change them. (nonfiction) (intermediate)

Lost series by Tod Olson

Lost in the Amazon

On Christmas Eve, 1970, when flying over the Andes mountains, lightning strikes her plane and 17-year-old Juliane finds herself alone in the largest rainforest on Earth. (intermediate)

Through My Eyes by Ruby Bridges

What would it be like to have to enter school every day through a crowd of people shouting at you, to be the only student in your first grade class? Ruby Bridges tells what it was like for her to be the first to integrate a school in New Orleans in 1960. (nonfiction) (intermediate)

World War II Spies: An Interactive History Adventure

by Michael Burgan

Describes the role spies played during World War II through reader's choices in the narrative. (nonfiction)(beginning)

How to Be a World Explorer by Joel Levy

Illustrated guide to exploring the world's biomes, including what to wear and pack for different conditions, how to escape hazards like quicksand, what animals to expect and stories of past discoveries. (nonfiction) (intermediate)

Witches! The Absolutely True Tale of Disaster in Salem by Rosalyn Schanzer

Examines the famous Massachusetts witch hunt that took more than a dozen lives and ruined hundreds more. (nonfiction) (advanced)

USA--Culture Smart!: The Essential Guide to Customs and Culture by Gina Teague & Alan Beechey

This book gives you some valuable and interesting insights into the culture and customs of the USA.

Chomp by Carl Hiaasen

The difficult star of a reality TV show disappears while filming in the Florida Everglades. (advanced)

Liar, Liar by Gary Paulsen

Kevin is very good at lying and doing so makes life easier, but when he finds himself in big trouble with his friends, family, and teachers, he must find a way to end his lies forever. First in a series. (intermediate)

I, Funny by James Patterson & Chris Grabenstein

Resolving to become the world's greatest stand-up comedian despite less-than-funny challenges in his life, wheelchair-bound middle school student Jamie enters a local comedy contest. (beginning)

Long Way Down by Jason Reynolds

The Perks of Being a Wallflower by Stephen Chbosky

Absolutely Almost By Lisa Graff

He's not the smartest kid in school or the best at art or sports, but Albie is very determined to figure out what he excels at. (intermediate-advanced)

The Cruisers by Walter Dean Myers

Students caught in the middle of a mock Civil War learn the true cost of freedom of speech when they use their alternative newspaper, The Cruiser, to try to make peace. First in a series. (intermediate)

Swindle by Gordon Korman

After a collector cons him out of a valuable baseball card, Griffin puts together a band of misfits to steal the card back. First in a series. (intermediate)

Chained by Lynne Kelly

Hastin leaves his village in India to work as an elephant keeper, but many challenges await him, including trying to keep Nandita, a sweet elephant, safe from the cruel circus owner. (beginning)
