The Coast Salish people are a group of Salish-speaking, ethnically connected indigenous people living in the Pacific Northwest Coast from the mouth of the Columbia River in Oregon to the Bute Inlet in British Columbia. Archaeological evidence indicates that Coast Salish regions have been inhabited since 9000 BC and today there is an estimated 56,000 Coast Salish peoples living in the US and Canada. Here is a (very short) look at these fascinating histories on Canada's West coast. The Coast Salish tribe consists of three geographically divided areas. These are Northern Coast, Central Coast, and Southern Coast. They are located along the coastline of the Northwest United States and Canada. Their first encounter with European explorers was with Juan de Fuca in 1592. Reports and diaries of early explorers indicated that the Coast Salish had a complex society. They had the advantage of settling in permanent homes built of timber, which grew profusely in the region. A longhouse at the Museum of Anthropology at the University of British Columbia. The interior walls of longhouses were typically lined with sleeping platforms. Storage shelves above the platforms held baskets, tools, clothing, and other items.
